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SENATOR BEUTLER: If a manufacturer or distributor sold a car outside of Nebraska, they could deliver it in Nebraska if they went through the procedure that's described earlier in the bill?

SENATOR BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. They can go through the procedure and have delivery in Nebraska, but then we seem to be saying they can't follow that procedure if they operated by mail or the Internet, unless...

SENATOR BROMM: Unless they deliver in Nebraska through a dealer.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, you may continue.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so...so even though they sell over the Internet or by mail, if they deliver in Nebraska and use the procedure in the previous pages, they're all right? See, I don't know...what does it mean to comply with the various sections here?

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah. Well, you've got...of course, you've got a lot of provisions in the franchise law that we haven't been talking about. And it would be all of those...

SENATOR BEUTLER: What...what would they have to do, I guess, is the question I have? There are so many provisions there. Is there...why are they...why are they referenced? What is it that...that they want them to do, besides Section 3, besides the delivery in Nebraska provisions in this bill? Is there anything else that...

SENATOR BROMM: I think...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that they're supposed to do before they can sell by Internet or by mail?

SENATOR BROMM: I think what...I think what...what that is primarily trying to do is to establish that they have to abide by the same rules and regulations with respect to...to the consumer as any dealer would have to. They're subject to the
