PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Bromm. The question is the adoption of the Bromm amendment to LB 1018. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed nay. Mr. Clerk, please record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Bromm's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, on the advancement of LB 1018.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, Marie Antoinette, at some point, was alleged to have said to the poor people who didn't have bread, well, let them eat cake. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm.
