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think this is one of those circumstances where we need to look at the future. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Janssen, followed by Senator Landis, Bohlke, Thompson, Smith, Baker, Redfield and Hartnett. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. I also stand in support of Senator Bohlke's proposal. You know I look at...I look at teenage smoking, young adults who are getting started to smoke, and it's kind of like a bunch of kids, or a couple of kids in a fight. You can break that fight up, but it's going to start again. But, if you let those kids settle it amongst themselves, it's always much more effective. And I think this kind of leads that way, this proposal leads to that solution, when you have kids, young adults working out the solutions. You know, it's a heck of a lot easier to pull a rope than it is to push one. And I think by leading or pulling young adults into a scenario like Senator Bohlke is proposing, you're going to see a lot better results. The Excellence in Health Care Council, certainly they are in charge, or we put them in charge of these monies that are being generated from the interest off this tobacco settlement. But if, you know, if we're going to have to make a request for those dollars to come out, what a great way to start, what a great way to start. And it's helping, it would be helping young people get a good start in their education. I think that this is a great way to start, can't think of a better way. And I can just envision some of the ads or the statements that these young people will make. And kids listen to kids, they don't like to listen to adults; they don't like to be forced into something. You can't always buy your way in and out of situations by forcing people to do something they don't want to, especially young people. I think this is a great way to start on a situation. And the results, we've heard from Senator Bohlke about the results in other states, I don't know whether that was the whole situation behind the drop, but I'll bet you it was...I'll bet you it was one of the leading factors to the...to lowering the teenage use of tobacco in the state of Florida. I don't know what other programs they have. I don't know what their sales have done in those states, but I bet they went down. So along with supporting this right now, I'm open to any other
