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piece that would be...that would look a lot different than LB 505, but then would have a chance of effectiveness.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** One minute.

**SENATOR LANDIS:** What I fear is that with the passage of LB 1436 the body will be allowed to say we've declared victory on youth smoking and walk away. And if we're going to say we're going to declare victory on youth smoking and walk away, then I think we ought to do a better job at securing a real program to do that. If LB 505 is too large, and it may be, this is too small. If we're going to declare victory, we should get a good deal more than this in aiming at education. Thank goodness we're coming to lunch, because it gives us all a chance to think about this, talk to Ardyce privately, spend her moments. I am concerned that Senator Smith, Senator Janssen, Senator Bohlke, I bet Senator Baker has got his light on, they are probably going to speak in favor of this bill. All the people who said LB 505 was too big, all four of those who wouldn't vote for it, fair enough, but I think, if that is too big, we got to find a reasonable middle ground. And so far LB 1436 is too...

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Time.

**SENATOR LANDIS:** ...modest to be a reasonable middle ground at this point.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Bohlke.

**SENATOR BOHLKE:** Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. And thank you, Senator Landis. I do want to tell you all of us realize the amount of time and effort Senator Landis had put into LB 505. And I want to tell you of someone else came forward with an idea that was not, as he says, he and I have discussed this; we see these as stand alone projects. But some people would not be willing to do that. And Senator Landis was willing to do that, and I appreciate that. And I'm going to respond to some of the suggestions, criticisms of the bill. Senator Landis says this is too small. That actually was raised in committee from some of the people who testified. I have said when this would move off, if it would move off of General File and have a great deal of support, I'm not opposed to upping the amount.
