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Now, where we disagree is where we get those funds. I have said that I think it is absolutely appropriate to come from the interest off the Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund. But I do...I would very much be in favor of increasing the amount of money. But first I have to see the lay of the land and the general support. Senator Byars talks about and mentioned that I was one of the 43 members who voted not to do what we're about to do today. But I remind you that Senator Janssen was going to have his priority bill be coming and taking 50 percent of the interest money back here to the Legislature. So philosophically I think Senator Jensen had already bought into that. We were going to as a Legislature have some say-so with about 50 percent of the money, of the interest off the settlement. Senator Byars came to this body last year and asked us to fund respite care from the tobacco. Was it not? He's saying...he's saying no. Okay, I'm sorry, Senator Byars. I thought I remembered that at one point in time you were asking to fund respite care from tobacco. I'm sorry. But the point is this, that should we as a Legislature be able to absolutely direct where a small portion of the interest from the Tobacco Settlement Trust Fund should go? I say, yes, and in fact I believe if we don't we're being negligent. I think we're being negligent in not saying that this body, this Legislature sees that as a state settlement. And, as I said, each one of us represent about 32,000 people, collectively we do represent the state, these are state funds, and I think it is very appropriate that we fashion something that directly targets what I think generally everyone has agreed is a noble goal, we all agree on that, preventing teen smoking. I don't think I've ever had a bill that I wouldn't be open to working with people on their suggestions. I've done that already on this bill. I was surprised at some of the medical people coming in and opposing it. When I returned one phone call and asked why, they said, because you didn't check with us first. And I said, well you know what, this is a novel idea; but just perhaps once in a while we state senators actually come up with an idea and write a piece of legislation ourselves. That's what I did. I said I'm guilty and I'm proud of being guilty that I didn't check with you first. So go fish. But that may...it irritated me because that gives us all a bad reputation.
