PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Jensen, on advancement LB 1436.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the body. The trust fund dollars will be the largest fund that this state has ever had before it. The Governor said, a couple weeks ago when we talked about some of the issues, he says, you know, I hope that we can look back ten years from now at the trust fund and say we really accomplished something there at that particular time; that we really set forth a program to fund public health issues into this twenty-first century. And I'd hope also that ten years from now we can look back and say we did a good thing back in the year 2000 when we set into...into...in the process a funding mechanism for healthcare. Certainly, these are dollars from the Tobacco Fund, but right now, today, the majority of these dollars come from intergovernmental transfer funds, not from Tobacco Funds. The majority comes from IGT funds, not Tobacco Funds. A year from now I can't say that probably, but at this point in time these are not entirely Tobacco Funds, and if you want to look at the program in there you'll see that. So if you say these are Tobacco Funds, we need to spend them on tobacco issues, that's partially true, but it's not 100 percent true. Also, I wanted to support the bill, but I cannot do that at this point in time when we're raiding, and I mean raiding, a fund. Now, members of the body, some of you were not here when Senator Warner was here and, like Senator Byars mentioned, if you talked about raiding the Highway Trust Fund dollars, he would stand up and then he might take you over in a corner and explain to you, listen, young man, do you understand what you're doing here; do you understand the road system that we've set forth in this state and how we're going to fund roads forever? I hope that some day we can look at the trust fund dollars the same way and say this was done for public health, this was done to...mind you, Nebraska is number 50 in public health in the nation and we're 50 percent below number 49. Now are we going to take these dollars and say this is the number one priority of these funds? And that's what we're doing right now today. This is the number
