SENATOR BROMM: We could take the two individuals first, and I understand the basis for the division.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. Any further discussion on the confirmation report? Seeing none, the first vote is for Ann Boyle and Georgia Janssen. Those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal page 753.) 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the first component of the confirmation report.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. The second vote is on the remainder of the members that have been appointed to Nebraska Transit and Rail Advisory Council. All in favor vote aye...Senator Chambers, you wanted to say something more?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Madam President, members of the Legislature, nobody who is seeking a vote cares why you vote yes, therefore, it was not necessary for me to comment on why I voted yes for the women. But this is an ongoing protest I have about the way appointments by the Governor do not take adequate cognizance of females and groups lumped together under the term "minorities". These gentlemen probably are as qualified as anybody to receive these appointments. My no vote has nothing to do with their qualification nor is it designed to cast an aspersion on anyone individually or the group collectively, but I am compelled to vote no. And, Madam President, I must say the way you handled Senator Bromm gave me a notion of how I'm going to deal with him in the future. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Seeing no further discussion, Senator, we are voting on the second division of the question, the remainder of those people on that committee. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal pages 753-754.) 33 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on the adoption of the confirmation report.
