SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: My support for, sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay. Suppose...what if we adopt my amendment,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...then you and those who say that despite the fact...let me simplify the question. Is it true that under this bill, money is to be generated by the Law Enforcement Training Academy, which was not the case before this bill?.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: That's right, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And is it true under this bill, the amounts of tuition and fees can be adjusted to meet the costs that accrue?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes, Senator Chambers, on page 6, Section 7 above, lines 5 through 9, it says exactly that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will continue my questioning because I think my time is out. I turn my light on.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We are open for discussion on the Chambers amendment, FA297, to LB 994. Those senators wishing to speak are Senators Coordsen, Beutler, Dwite Pedersen, Schmitt, Chambers, and Smith. Senator Coordsen, on the amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Of course, we know that the amendment, as proposed by Senator Chambers, would strike some of the funding that's currently going to the Law Enforcement Training Center if it continues in the manner that is currently configured. I need to ask Senator Dwite Pedersen a question, if I may.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Pedersen? Senator Pedersen. Senator Dwite Pedersen.
