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SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. And I give the rest of my time to Senator Beutler.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Pedersen, again, if I may, just to get a better handle on the numbers, the...under the new system the local political subdivisions, for example, will not be contributing. Have they been contributing now to the edu...

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: No, they have not. What they have been doing is paying the officer's salary while he goes through the training.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and they wouldn't be doing this...would they be...would they be still be doing this under the new system?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Most likely, but they don't have to because people could go to this school without. There is such a thing now as tuition fees paid by the individual but there's just no positions open because we've got so many police officers being hired who aren't trained and they have first option to the...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. But with regard to that portion of the training that takes place at the center, would the...would the local political subdivisions be funding those officers, some officers still?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: I would see that not happening. I would see that the...you would graduate, for instance, from the University of Nebraska with a degree in criminal justice and you go on to take the...or maybe while you're there you take these many courses that pertain to the required courses that you have to have for the training academy and then have them all in line when you go to the training academy and register.

SENATOR BEUTLER: What is it anticipated that the tuition will be, the tuition and fees will be for these...for these people under the new system?
