sorry, there are probably some that...that need to be there, but their usefulness has dwindled over the years and by...if you can't...if you can't get someone to come and tell you why they need to be left in place, you can't find anyone to write or call, then apparently that board or that commission doesn't need to be there. Senator Schimek brought up the question about the sunset. Yes, I believe that we should probably sunset every board and commission that we put in...put into place. If they are a well-functioning board or commission, they can be given a little more life. But this would eliminate the hard work that's had...that the committee and staff have went to...had to go through, and also with some of the staff members of the...of the...or the staff people of some of the members of the Government Committee also put...had some input. Most everyone on the...on the...well, everyone on the committee was sent a list of the boards and commissions and we were to submit them back to Senator Schimek for our ideas on whom should be eliminated and who should stay and I believe, to my knowledge, that everyone on the...on the committee took part in that over the interim. Once again, we have to be a little careful when we appoint these boards and commissions, make sure that there is a time limit on them. I think it's very important, very important, and if they are nonfunctioning, that way they can be eliminated when their time is...their time allotment is up. With that, thank you again, Senator Schimek, for bringing the bill to us and I think it's very important and I will be supporting LB 1135. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Crosby, on the advancement of LB 1135.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Just a very quick thank you again, as other people have thanked Senator Schimek and her committee, for working so diligently to ferret out these commissions which are no longer functioning, obviously. This bill...I think probably that DiAnna and I have been looking at the commissions ever since we came in to the Legislature, trying to figure out, because people always complain that we have so many commissions. But, as Senator Janssen indicated, too, we must always remember that most of these, they're...all of them, are constituent-driven. Most of us don't get up in the morning and think, well, I'll set up a
