will not be placed on the agenda until there's been at least two legislative days after it's been on General File. That would allow people to see it, have any committee amendments printed in the Journal, and have a day for people to review it, so there won't be a bill pop out and the very next day be on the agenda without you having a chance to look at it. We're going to, in most cases when a bill has not been completed, we're going to try to go back to that. That bill will be open and we'll try to continue on with the next time we go back to that spot. So, if the bill is open and being actively debated, we'll go back to it. Also note that if we're going to pass over a bill more than once, that may jeopardize its original place. You can pass over them once, but, if we're going to start two or three passes, that may jeopardize its order as it goes along. I'll put that out so you can look at it, but just in terms of general information. Mr. Clerk, we next move to legislative confirmation reports.

CLERK: Mr. President, two confirmation reports, both from the General Affairs Committee. Senator Janssen, the first report I have is Rhonda Flowers...Rhonda Flower, excuse me, the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Chairman of the General Affairs Committee, Senator Janssen, you're recognized to open on the reports.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, the first one, I believe, that we are considering is for the Liquor Control Commission. She is a new member, her name is Rhonda Flower, and she is from Scottsbluff, Nebraska. She was appointed by Governor Johanns. We heard...the hearing was held a couple weeks ago, and she's doing a fine job right now on the Liquor Commission. She's well versed on all the subject matter that comes before them. She's an attorney and married and, I believe, has children, I believe there are some children, and she is from Senator Smith's district. With that, I would like you to approve the confirmation of Ms. Flower to the Liquor Control Commission.
