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SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: How do they get through the police academy if they're not hired by one...

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: By us opening more slots, by moving the academics out, we will have more positions open in the academy for people to pay for their own tuition while they're going through the academy.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So there will be an alternative system of people paying their tuition in the academy, as well as in...

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yeah, and there is now, it's just have...they haven't been able to get them people in, because they have to take the ones that have been hired first.

SENATOR BEUTLER: These people that have not been hired first, do they pay the full cost of their tuition at the academy?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: I'm not real sure of that, but I think they pay the biggest part...I know they pay the biggest part of it. There are still some state...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: ...state funds that go into it, obviously, like there is into the university system or the college system.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, if I could simply refresh us as to what transpired yesterday. The...the amendment to the amendment maintains the status quo from now through January 1, 2007, which is a while. The amendment by Senator Chambers would remove the \$2 court fee, which aggregates to the sum per annum of about \$500,000. Senator Chambers would
