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Basically an untrained officer, but giving them the power to do a few...few little things in the community. As I seen it, it was probably not more than being an animal catcher. But if them type of people, untrained, were brought into these fields, positions, without a certification, what would they do when they come across domestic violence? The reason Senator Wickersham brought them kind of bills is because they, in the small communities, could not hire police officers, train them and keep them. It's been a problem for the small communities. They've paid their salaries, sent these people to the training academy, the state trained them, they got their certification and went out and hung their shingle out as being a certified officer and found a better job than what the small communities could pay them for. This bill basically opens up the training academy to serve more people than it is now. And the way it does that, it takes the academic courses out of the academy, gives them to the universities and the colleges and the community schools, colleges, to do that training, and then the police officer, the person who's interested in becoming a police officer, finish the academics, then they can apply and pay their own tuition to go to the police academy. That's available now, but there's no positions left because they keep having to train the people who have been hired as police officers first. I worked with some young men, security guards, down at the Douglas County Hospital who are...been interested in getting into police work for some years. Some of them have studied, taken the education and stuff, but have not got hired with police departments and would like to become certified. They don't even know if they can pass the screening, because they have not been able to even get that far. We have a shortage of police officers in this state, certified police officers. And I believe, by this bill, we will create, in the future, a pool of certified police officers that, when a community wants to hire a police officer, they will go to this pool, they'll interview them and they'll hire the best police officer, and we will have a better police officer on the street because of it. This is not a bill that says that our police officers now are not doing their job, because we've got wonderful law enforcement in the state of Nebraska. But it does give us an opportunity to make what we have better. With that, I would encourage you to vote for the bill, and I'd like to give a couple of minutes of my time to Senator Wickersham.
