two down the road, are saying, well you did this and in terms of the percentage reimbursement it really hasn't gone up any. That's maybe not likely, but it's at least possible. Okay, one other questions concerns suppose you have a school system that receives the 83 percent, and you mentioned the other...the other 17...the other 17 percent, they would have to absorb some other way. And I just wanted to follow that through a little bit with you. In effect, what would happen is that that other 17 percent would go onto General Fund operating expenses for the system. And then down the road a year that would be incorporated in the General Fund expenses that are used to calculate the cost group average so that the school system could reimburse or could recover part or all of that through a higher cost, group cost per student, which may lead to higher state aid. Am I correct on that?

SENATOR BOHLKE: I'm sorry, Senator Raikes. The...when we would do this, there...there...if you decrease...if you...if you take the amount that is now going that increases the cost per student, and we send more money out, there would be the possibility of lowering...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BOHLKE: ...the cost per student that schools would figure. Is that...and I didn't get to hear the final question.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, I was simply trying to track through how we now or I guess would continue with the current law, allow schools to recover that extra 17 percent of special ed costs. And there is a recovery mechanism in place, through higher costs, group costs and thereby higher state aid, but it's a relatively indirect recovery. Is that correct?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Right. That's correct, you would cover some of it, but not...recover some of it, but not all of it.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, all right, thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Senator Janssen, you are next in order, and followed by Senators Vrtiska, Bromm and Kristensen.
