SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Tyson. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the body, I'm going to speak on the merits of LB 510 and then urge you to vote against the motion to reconsider. I don't think LB 510 goes far enough. I think we should allow good attorneys from anywhere to come in and run. That way, we could have...we could have had the late William Kunstler, who was an excellent attorney, to satisfy all the attorneys who want a good attorney, or we could have Judge Robert Bork, on the other side of the spectrum. Political parties do make a difference because they identify philosophies at the initial winnowing out stage. Think about it in terms of William Kunstler and Robert Bork and then see if just being a good attorney is sufficient, and I urge you to vote against the motion to reconsider. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Seeing no further lights, Senator Bourne, you're recognized to close on your motion to reconsider.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. Again, this vote here is just to reconsider the vote on LB 510 and I would appreciate your support in the reconsideration motion. Thank you.
