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fairly...a fairly basic amendment, and let me just explain what it does in a nutshell. It does state that no pickle card operator shall be obligated to sell pickle cards exclusively on behalf of one licensee to the exclusion of all others. And so basically what this amendment is aimed at doing is to be fair to all the charities that are out there that wish to sell pickle tickets and allow them to even have, if these electronic machines are going to be in licensed locations, there can be more than just one charity represented at that licensed location. And so, just to make it in a nutshell, I would urge support of this amendment. I'm not exactly sure who would come up and speak against it. It's just simply to level the playing field so that all charities get an equal...equal chance. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator. Discussion on the adoption of AM2540 to LB 659? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members of the body, I guess I'd ask Senator Quandahl a couple questions, just because I thought there would be somebody else talking and would flesh this out. Is...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Quandahl, would you...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...was this another bill?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: No, actually, this is not another bill.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And is...is that going on now that people have restrictions on who they sell for and who they won't, or do things exclusively or not? I am not really familiar in this area.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I guess I can't necessarily speak to that right now. This would just make it so that if...if somebody did try to obtain an exclusive relationship they wouldn't be able to do that, so that they couldn't exclude the VFW or the volunteer fire department or a sports team.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: What's the reason for that, that we want to change...is it a problem? I really don't know the basis for the
