equipment provider is involved also. Is that true?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I believe that is correct, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The second part of your amendment would say, "and such equipment shall not be purchased, leased, or rented if the purchase, lease, or rental is based upon an obligation requiring such operator to only sell individual pickle cards on behalf of such licensed organization to the exclusion of all others". Suppose an operator wants to sell only one...for only one organization?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I don't think that this language actually prohibits an "op" from selling just for one location.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, they couldn't purchase the equipment or lease it or rent it. If I am a pickle card operator, I could not purchase, lease or rent equipment if...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I had to enter an agreement to sell only behalf of...on behalf of one licensed organization. Isn't that true?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I understand your concern, but I don't know that that's exactly the way that I would read that...that provision.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, how do you read it?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I would read it, it gives...it gives an operator the option as to whether or not to...to grant an exclusive license to a particular lessor.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If the equipment operator says the only way I'll let you rent this equipment is if you agree to sell pickle cards only for whoever, then that pickle operator could not lease, rent, or purchase that equipment under such an agreement, could he or she?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I believe that is correct, that is right.
