

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will turn on my light again because I don't want to cut you off in midstream.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature. Senator Quandahl, if I could carry on just a little conversation with you, please. Would you answer a few questions?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Certainly.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Quandahl, right now, if I owned a...a...say a tavern in Walthill, Nebraska, and I had a VFW that was selling pickle tickets, had a license to sell the pickle tickets, and the Lions Club in this particular town also had a pickle ticket license, could I...could I, right now, not put those pickle tickets into my establishment for each organization?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: If you wanted to...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: ...I mean there's two organizations in your town...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: ...and you wanted to put pickle tickets for both of them in your establishments...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That's allowed under current law, yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. If I had...if I chose not to, if I said, no, I want to only use one, I could do that.
