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SENATOR QUANDAHL: I guess I would have to agree with you on that point, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And Senator Bourne could not rent it to me. It applies to both of us, isn't that true? I, as the lessee, cannot lease it from him; he, as the lessor, cannot lease it to me if this were the law and that proviso were in the agreement. Isn't that true?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: I guess I could not argue with that, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And is that what you want to put into the law, something that broad?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Probably not and I guess I would be willing to work on it to sharpen it down to do what my stated purpose was.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: My light is on. I will, now that we've agreed on that point, give you a chance to tell me what your...your purpose will be, and I will give whatever time I have on this time back to the Chair at this point because there's no much left anyway.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. We are discussing the Chambers amendment to AM2540. Those wishing to speak are Senators Wehrbein, Chambers, Jensen, Landis, and Senator Bourne. Senator Wehrbein, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I know very little about this issue but I'm having trouble understanding the scope of the problem and so, therefore, I don't understand whether the solution is here or not. But if Senator Quandahl or Senator Janssen...Jensen wants to correct me in what I foresee, as we go in to machines we're raising the ante, raising the cost of being in the pickle business, as I see it. That's the reason for this amendment. Under the pickle situation now they can sell...one business can sell for the VFW
