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and another person can sell for the Lions Club, another person can sell for the local community center, whatever. There can be exclusiveness now but it isn't a problem because the cost is so low. Once we get into these machines with an additional cost, then it becomes easy to be exclusive. And maybe the local drug store doesn't want to sell for two or three people. They only want to continue to sell for the one that they're doing now, in other words, a charity function. Under this, because there's machines involved at additional expense, this could become fairly exclusive because they won't want to put in a machine but others won't want to use them because they're going to have an additional expense of having a machine or they'll have to stay with the old pickles. So it looks like we've created a problem if we go to machines because of the expense involved. The question is I don't know whether there's an extent here...I don't know whether exclusivity is a population notion or not. I think some people will want exclusively to continue to sell for what they want; others are going to say I only...I want to sell for several, which then will dilute the charity as an individual...as the take of that. So it's very confusing to me, but I...I don't know whether this solves the problem, and I don't know that much about it, but I would appreciate someone that maybe is an expert on this, such as the Chairman of the General Affairs Committee or the sponsor of the amendment to comment on the general gist of this problem before we even try to solve it, if I have generally a handle on what the dilemma is. Senator Janssen, I'll ask you first.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes. Yes, I will, Senator Wehrbein. The way...with the Chambers amendment, what we're on right now, it would...the way I read it, it would allow you either to enter into a contract or you wouldn't have to. I mean it's still back to the basic thing, it's your establishment, you can do what you want to do. I mean, if you want to...if you want to have a machine in that's going to...the person says the only thing you can have in this machine are the pickle tickets for, say, for the Lions Club. All right, that's fine. If you want to enter into a contract like that, it's your business. Or you wouldn't have to enter into a contract. You want to put your machine in
