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in one of those biblical gospels that such a comment was made, and honorary "Luke" sitting to my right...my left front, is the one who started me to thinking about this bill in a different way from the way in which I had been thinking of it. I would like to ask Senator "Luke" a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Bourne?

SENATOR BOURNE: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bourne, did you, in fact, have a conversation with me, I think it was yesterday, about this bill?

SENATOR BOURNE: I did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did it seem to you, as we discussed it, that you might be making progress in terms of removing some of the resistance that I had to the bill?

SENATOR BOURNE: Yes, it did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did I tell you that I would think about it and draw appropriate conclusions or words to that effect?

SENATOR BOURNE: You did say that you would consider not opposing the bill, that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Bourne. I needed to have that in the record because I had stated, and I meant it at the time, that I was going to kill this bill or do everything I could to kill it, but talking to Senator Bourne opened my mind just a wee bit. My seatmate in the culture corner, Senator Thompson, with her perceptive self, saw a glimmer and then a gleam of light, and she told me about an incident that happened to a young person who had been sentenced or placed in a facility outside of Nebraska. She probably will go into more detail. Is it your intention to do that, Senator Thompson? I'm not going to try to relate it then, because she has a better grasp of that situation. But when things happen to people when they're confined, I am more troubled by that than if the same thing happens to a person who is free to move about and make choices and decisions, even if they're unwise, but would have a degree
