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wondered, if there was any deep, deep, deep thought on the 45 percent? And there is not necessarily, but on the other hand it's a...it's an intermediate or almost short-term goal, intermediate goal, if you will. That's the way this bill could be accurately summarized. Is that right? You can have the rest of my time, if there's any left.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wickersham, there is about one minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Okay. Senator Wehrbein, in...I'm glad you made your comments. It did...it did call to mind one other aspect of this particular change that's being proposed in the state aid formula. You're correct that any time we want to change the projected level at which we wanted property taxes to be supporting K-12 education, we could. And this gives us a clear mechanism to do that. All you have to do is change the percentage from 45 to 40, or from 45 to 50, gosh forbid. You under...I wouldn't want to go in that direction. But it gives us a clear mechanism for affecting that relationship and adjusting that relationship as we find the need or the resources to do that, clearly enables us to do that by just changing one number. Not a very complicated thing to do. And the other issue about whether we will come to a relationship in funding for...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Raikes and Senator Wickersham. Senator Bohlke, did you wish to talk on the bill yet? You're recognized to talk then.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I had said I wished to talk on the bill, but some issues have been raised here, I guess, so I'll proceed. Listening to the conversation between Senator Wehrbein and Senator Wickersham, I think it's important for us to recognize that many states have a goal of actually 40 percent from property tax, and 60 percent from sales and income. And many of you probably read the article that Kansas is actually 30 percent from property, 70 percent from sales and income. So I certainly think the 45 percent is something I support. I think the bill has a number, with the amendment, has a number of positive aspects. And I just strongly support both the amendment and the bill. As I had said
