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opportunities for students across the state and the equalization formula is one means to that end. So to suggest that levy limits in themselves, whatever level that they're set at, are disequalizing, I don't believe, again with apologies to my friend, Senator Raikes, is really relevant to this discussion. And, if they are, then we ought to...if your...if your equalization of all kinds is ultimately your objective, then we should repeal the levy limits. But I doubt that anybody will want to do that. The discussion about whether or not we could change our minds in future years is relevant. And we certainly could change our mind in future years. And in fact the bill makes it somewhat easier to change our mind in future years, because we would just change the percentage. The earlier discussion was lowering the percentage, which increases the state's commitment. Senator Kristensen wants us to consider the obverse, that if in some time we wanted to reduce state support for schools, we could do that, and we could, we could change the percentage. We had that discussion last year. Changing the percentage would mean higher property taxes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: We may at some point in time, under some set of circumstances, in this Legislature vote to have higher property taxes. I don't think it's going to be this year, I don't think it's going to be next year. At some point in time we might do that. We have done that in the past. We did that in 1991, as a matter of fact. We might do that sometime in the future. We can do that. I don't want us to do that. I know of no circumstances now that would compel us to do that, but we could do that, we could do that, whether this bill passes or not. And paradoxically, from my viewpoint, the bill makes it somewhat easier to do that, at least up to a dollar levy for schools. It is that aspect that I would be concerned about is that it somehow makes it just a little bit easier for us to do that because the mechanisms are put in place to do that. And again I'll assert that's something I don't want to do,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...wouldn't do any circumstances that I know of now.
