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statute a specific percentage that's going to apply across the board regardless of how land is valued is not even wise, although that consideration has not prevented certain bills from passing this Legislature anyway. But this is the time for us to think about those things when a decision like this is to be taken. And I think this bill ought not to be advanced. If it is advanced, I think considerably more discussion needs to take place on Select File after some of our colleagues become more aware of the implications of this bill. The "Wizard" wouldn't be called the "Wizard" for nothing. The term wizard comes into play because it's a person who sees things in a way that others cannot see them, who can cause other people to see them the way the wizard wants them to see them, and as a result that which appears very normal to the ordinary person is ignored, and the wizardry comes into play, not deception but misdirection, illusion. The reality is always there unchanging, but the wizard is able to get you to view it a certain way. And as a result, you see things that are not there, and you don't see things which are there, or as the magician says, now you see it, now you don't. What I want to suggest is that we need to keep our eyes focused on the realities of...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...how this legislation will come into play in the real world. And I do say that if a decision is made to cause the state to pay 55 percent of the load, the state should have 55 percent of the control. We should be setting statewide standards and they should be mandatory. The hand that feeds is the hand that controls. Now I probably couldn't stop this bill, and I wouldn't even dig my heels in to try. But on other bills, on other bills...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There are no further lights on. Senator Wickersham, did you wish to close on the advancement of LB 1107?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I think I'll do that. Mr. President, members of the body, I understand Senator Chambers' desire to have additional debate and discussion of the implications of this bill. I think that we have gone through a number of those issues. And if there are additional concerns or additional
