Legislature. The amendment, which is AM2481, which is relatively thick, I will attempt to start summarizing for you. And, if I run out of time, I'll...I'll hope to finish it on the committee amendment introduction. First of all, AM2481 takes out the "opt-out" provisions that are in the law, it strikes them. And those provisions were along the line that there had to be a notice on the driver's license application or certificate of title that said that certain personal information is subject to public record, disclosure as a public record, unless the individuals chooses to prohibit such disclosure by filing a form with the department. That is taken out, and that is...that's about the first...about all that there is in the first 29 pages of the amendment. Then we get into...starting at about page 30, Section...Section 10 of the amendment, Section 12, Section 11, along in there we get into changing the definitions, which is necessary in order to implement the Shelby amendment. In the personal information that can be disclosed, we take out the words photograph, computerized image, Social Security Number, and medical or disability information, so that those cannot be disclosed. Then we define sensitive, personal information, which is the...which is the operator license photograph, again, computerized image, Social Security Number and medical or disability information. That is sensitive, personal information that can't be disclosed for purposes of most anything, except for permitted exceptions. Now, the sensitive, personal information, except as provided in Section 60-483 and 484 of the statutes, and Section 14 in this amendment cannot be disclosed by any person or agent of the Department of Motor Vehicles without the express consent of the person. And that express consent has to be notarized and it's very specific. Section 14, which starts on page 34 of the amendment, sets out what the department can disclose and to whom they can disclose it. They can still disclose information to a law enforcement agency for their use in investigation. They can disclose this information pursuant to a federal, state or local court order or administrative agency for purposes of litigation. They can disclose information related to a commercial driver's license in connection with the Motor Vehicle Safety Act. And that...that is...is pretty much the parameters of the amendment, which I think I've been able to give in the introduction of the bill. I think to summarize it would be important to understand that in accordance with federal law changes we are taking out
