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or any other state. Political views do make a difference and it is important that we understand who those people are that have what political views. This is something that I think...well, it is one of the...Senator Schimek and I don't often see eye to eye. We have different political philosophies. One of Senator Chambers' bugaboos, as it were, is a man by the name of Dr. Thomas Sowell. He wrote a book about the conflict of visions. People gain these political views and they carry them into their everyday life and they carry them into their political life. I would offer to you that it is important that we have those identifications, and I urge you to sustain the Governor's veto. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Tyson. Further debate, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. President, members, I guess we all like to justify why we do certain things, and on this issue here, I guess it's difficult maybe to come up with any concrete answer. I think Governor Johanns is doing a great, great job. I like him and I agree with almost every thing he does, but what's that got to do with this here? I like the Republican Party. They do a great job, and I am a good Republican. Most people know that. What's it got to do with this? I like the Democrats, too, most of them anyhow. (Laughter) But what's that got to do with...what's that got to do with this here? Really nothing. It's a philosophy. It boils down to a philosophy. If I knew for one second that Senator Chambers was doing this to be anti any one individual, I wouldn't vote for this absolutely. I'd say absolutely no. I read in the paper where Senator Chambers initiated this bill or introduced it maybe 20, 30 years ago once, and I haven't really talked to him about this, but I read that. What's that got to do with any individual? The person we have now in the Attorney General's Office, he was a baby at that time. He wasn't even here. The Governor, he was probably a baby. He's not very old either. But, anyway, this is an old concept that he's had in his mind for a long time, and I think it should be here. Why not? It simply has nothing to do with Republicans or the Democrats, whether you like somebody or whether you don't like somebody and that's...I guess that's why I'm justifying...I'm justifying my vote and I guess we have to do that once in awhile. But as far as the Governor, I think
