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we've chosen not to do that because, particularly in the telephone world, with the new competitive environment and with the passage of the federal act, there's a lot of things that we need to have done, decided and accomplished. And we can't do that on the floor of the Legislature. It would be dangerous to have us do that. And so we've delegated those things over to the Public Service Commission. But now when we try to look at what sorts of things does the Public Service Commission do, we struggle on how to treat them. And ultimately we're going to have to make those decisions and decide how we're going to deal with the Public Service Commission. And I know that there is always some apprehension there. That's been true for the last, at least the last dozen years. There was a period of time when we were ready to do away with the Public Service Commission because there really was nothing for them to do and now, all of a sudden, there's too much for them to do and they need additional staff, they need lots of things to accomplish their work. But I would caution that just because we're not really sure what to do doesn't mean we shouldn't do anything. And I would hope that as we begin to examine this procedural issue that Senator Bromm and the committee brings, then we also try to develop some policy on how we're going to treat the Public Service Commission. Obviously we're going to be looking to see if they accomplish the things that we want them to do. But at the same time, if they don't, who else does it? And that's going to be our problem to deal with. Now, Senator Bromm, I appreciate your offer to work. I would...I think I've outlined and would tell you that most of the problems I have, the problems with the fining authority and the stays and so on are problems, I think, we can work out and accomplish. But I would hope that when we come to Select File that this is not going to be a bill that's going to just walk over. It's going to take some time to get done. With that, I'd yield back my time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Further debate? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I can almost assure Senator Kristensen, without fear of contradiction from my company, US West, that this bill is not going to just walk over and not be given some attention. My
