which has been ordered. The other has to do with what we just discussed, and that is this automatic stay, which, under the amendment we adopted, no longer is the case. There is no automatic stay that comes into play when the one against whom an order is issued files an appeal. That doesn't bring everything to a halt. And we will discuss the concerns that Senator Kristensen expressed. And I will...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...continue to bring up the language that already is in the law. Sometime people whose interest will be affected, as the phone companies think theirs will under this bill, will look only at the new language. But there are safeguards already built into the law. I'm going to turn on my light again because I need a little bit more time.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'm kind of staking out a little bit of territory here by what I'm saying. And I do want some things in the record. The body has acted by amending this bill. I hope we understand what it is that we're doing. I'm going to presume that those who voted do understand. Even with that having been said, there is additional work that may be necessary. And I want the lobbyists, these people running around here in suits, but avoid me like the plague, Senator Bourne, and I'll talk to anybody, almost, with the exception of one person, and I notified him that he and I have nothing to talk about anymore, ever, e-v-e-r, six...six exclamation points, never, or did I say ever? Well, I think the point is clear.

SENATOR LANDIS: We got it, Ernie; we got it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But any other person, any other entity represented by a person I'm willing to treat with. But when people violate their word to me then they turn from being Cyclops, Goliath, to a moral Tom Thumb, and the Tom Thumb's know who they are. One thing I'll say about the person running for the third district, Mr. Osborne, he is a person that I could work with on a bill of this kind, because if he told me that he agrees with what we're doing, I could go to sleep on that and I
