Speak now, lobbyists, or forever hold your peace. Now it might sound like I'm doing a little lecturing this afternoon, but we're all grown. And if the hat I made doesn't fit anybody's head, nobody cares. And if the hat does fit a head, he or she ought to be smart enough to just be quiet, not let anybody know that it fits his or her head. The reason I say "his or her", I make hats of all kinds and sizes, young Senator Smith. I hope that what we do on this bill will also serve notice, not just to the big phone companies, but to other large interests that have had so much contempt for the Legislature and have run roughshod over us because they disrespect our prerogatives...
