SENATOR JANSSEN: When it comes here, if that minor was caught with that alcohol and they found out it did come from out of state, then I imagine that minor can be prosecuted.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, wouldn't a common carrier or whoever else is going to haul or transport this liquor, who is doing it inside the state, if...

SENATOR JANSSEN: It...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...this hauler inside this state is selling this liquor to these minors you can get that hauler right now for that, under the law.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I would...I would...I would...you know the law better than I do. I imagine you could, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, you know that if you or I sold liquor...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, all right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to a minor they could get us, couldn't they?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That's right, but this is...we had the three-tiered system in this state--the wholesaler, the retailer, and the consumer. They have to go and that has to be purchased at a liquor store who must abide with the...with the laws of the state.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then you're worried about liquor being shipped to liquor stores, not to minors.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No. No, no, I'm not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm...I'm lost.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, I'm not.
