SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Janssen, would you respond?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, did you draft this language...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Um...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...or did "Buffalo Bill"?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No. (Laugh) "Buffalo Bill," I think.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think really there is a problem with wagons bringing in this liquor? Maybe when children get it they might transport it in their little American Flyer, but in reality what...what significant transporting of liquor occurs by wagon?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That comes from old statute when...I guess when they...when they did bring things in by covered wagon.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you don't mind if I'd strike this word "wagon".

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, if...if...well, you can do that if you want to, but you don't suppose some wise guy would start bringing it in in a wagon then, do you?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if he did, he'd probably create a new industry and the Governor will quickly give him about three or four or five hundred thousand dollars as a loan, since he gave that big loan for people to make gun modifying equipment so that they can kill more of our children. So he, I'm sure, would give some money for the wagon trains. But you don't really have any objection to this particular amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, as long as it wouldn't...if someone wouldn't construe it to mean a trailer.
