SENATOR CHAMBERS: A trailer is a trailer. What kind of trailer is...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...could somebody...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...a wagon is a trailer, too.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You say what?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Trails behind.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You mean a "semi-wagon" is what they would call it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, it could be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Realistically, I don't think so. But the reason I want to find out how you feel about this amendment, so I can go from it to the parts of the bill that Senator Wickersham was talking about.

SENATOR JANSSEN: That would be fine.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now he mentioned the sales taxes that you cannot get on catalog sales unless, as you pointed out, the catalog...the one who is making the catalog sales would have a store in this state or some significant contacts...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Some contacts, right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...with the state so you could get them. But we're not talking about sales tax, because if this liquor were to be sold by a retailer, sales tax would be collected, so it's not the sales tax. He mentioned an excise tax. But if those taxes are paid in another state, they don't have to be paid here.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the state is not really the main reason
