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guess, and the liquor dealers and sellers and distributors. So why, since the individual can be ensnared, don't we place the tax at the origin of this liquor? We could do that under the law, couldn't we, if we chose to do it? Nebraska has the power to do that if Nebraska chose to do it, couldn't it? Let me...let me ask the question this way. Are there such operatives in Nebraska who are able to sell this liquor directly without paying the tax?

SENATOR CONNEALY: I think you'd probably have to ask somebody else. I think there are, but I'm not sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I'll ask Senator Janssen. Senator Janssen.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Janssen, would you yield?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Connealy was explaining these producers or whoever they are who can sell liquor direct to somebody and not have to pay these taxes. Are there such distributors operating in Nebraska?

SENATOR JANSSEN: That...that send liquor in here without paying taxes?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Operating within Nebraska who sell it in Nebraska without having to pay a tax because they make direct sales?

SENATOR JANSSEN: No. If they sell in...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Okay, so it doesn't affect anybody in Nebraska.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All liquor that's sold in Nebraska would pay this tax in Nebraska.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Would...would pay that tax. The consumer
