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violence convictions that flag them so that they cannot purchase a firearm. That is the first part of the bill to change. The second one is that the courts simply have to note...make a note on the disposition that it is domestic violence and it's simply a reporting issue and it tightens...it, thereby, does not allow the person convicted of misdemeanor domestic violence to purchase a firearm. That, in its simplest words, is the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, Senator Vrtiska was almost right in what he said about me not letting that bill go, but those questions I posed on that bill were legitimate questions and the bill needed discussion and probably could not be handled in 15 minutes even if it were not on consent calendar. But some of you who are younger than others on this floor never had the opportunity to be exposed to a program called "This Is Your Hit Parade." Well, what we're going to go through this morning is Senator Chambers' "hit parade." Senator Baker is presenting to us a bill this morning that had gone through the Judiciary Committee. I voted yes on this bill in Judiciary Committee but, as the philosophers and others say, circumstances alter cases, so I will not be voting yes on this bill this morning. I will not be voting on the bill itself at all this morning, and none of my colleagues will be voting at all on the bill itself this morning. The Legislature has allowed itself to be invaded by an alien influence and my colleagues decided to yield and they had their fun with me and their leader had fun with me. Their leader sent Larry Bare to waive a veto message under my nose to rub it in, and I told some of my colleagues about that and that's the way you like your Governor to operate and you're perfectly at liberty to follow his lead. But I had told you all that he cannot do damage in this Legislature except through members of the Legislature; and if members agree to let him come in and do that damage, then the price will not be paid by him. But as Senator Janssen was pointing out with the bill we just discussed a few minutes ago, somebody's got to pay the price. Somebody has to be the revenue agent to collect that tax which is due and owing, so this morning is the "hit parade"; but the "hit parade" is not going to be conducted with a shotgun.
