And committee staff just found the page for me on the other language, and it's on page 13 of the bill, where it talks about "any other person who might wish to put their name on the ballot", says they have to file and pay a filing fee. So the committee could have done it one of two ways, we could have either had everybody pay a filing fee or nobody pay a filing fee. And we decided to go, in this case, since it's a recall situation, it's a little bit different from an election situation, we decided to just dispense with a filing fee. I'd be happy to answer any questions.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Schimek. On the committee amendments to LB 1170, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'll be straight up on this, I'm opposed to what this bill is doing. But in case I'm misunderstanding, I'd like to ask Senator Schimek a question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Schimek.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, does this apply to any official who is subject to recall?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...except, except the trustees of the SIDs.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, by any official, I mean a mayor, a city council member, all the...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And...and I think the whole idea behind the bill is that, if you're going to recall somebody or try to recall somebody, you want to present the public with the name of the person who would be willing to take that person's place.
