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follow, I take it,...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...exactly the provisions of the National and Community Service Trust Act.

SENATOR AGUILAR: I'm sure they do, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator, thank you. That's...those are the only questions I had at this point.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have a few more questions that I need to ask. Senator Aguilar.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Aguilar, would you yield?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to turn to page 2, lines 21 and 22, where we're talking about the settings in which these kinds of services can occur. Are you with me?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why do we use the language again "including, but not limited to"? In other words, if you say residential and nonresidential, you've included just about everything. Then, when you say institutional and in-home settings, what is left that would not be covered by that language?

SENATOR AGUILAR: No, I really don't think anything is left, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So in some places where if we could cut out some of this extraneous language and leave the bill focusing on what actually is addressed I think would improve the bill. And the reason I'm discussing it with you rather than just offering amendments, there could be other settings that I'm unfamiliar
