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SENATOR JANSSEN: Um-hum. So they couldn't...they couldn't stand alone then. They'd...they are a part of that...

SENATOR AGUILAR: No, I don't think there's any...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...local government.

SENATOR AGUILAR: ...agencies out there that basically stand alone without the help of the counties or city.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Aguilar. That's all the questions I have right now. Thank you.

SENATOR AGUILAR: I would like to add also that, you were talking about high salaries and stuff, when we researched this we talked to some of the people and asked them how much cost they think they would incur if this was awarded to them and they all thought they could handle it with existing staff and within their own budgets right now. They would not have to put any additional cost into it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, are...your...are those...those people compensated in any way other than just their expenses?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Is there a salary connected with the organization you were talking about?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Are you talking about the administrators?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR AGUILAR: They are salaried right now through...

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. And they're salaried by...

SENATOR AGUILAR: ...through their own...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...by whom?
