money to get anything, if grants are given to some and not to others? Parts of the state still will remain unserved. I don't believe that adequate thought and care have gone into the preparation of the language of this bill. If I had the ability and the power to wish and my wishes are true, there'd be no sickness. So then we wouldn't have work for doctors, would we? I would think of something to wish for them, but wishes are not an adequate basis to put language into the statutes. These references to federal regulations and federal laws are not, in my opinion, done in a proper way so that that would be constitutional. When they talk about categories of populations to be served and they itemize practically every imaginable population of old people except those that are under the ground right now, and maybe if I stretched the definition, I could include them. So I wouldn't like to see the language "including but not limited to." When we say not limited to and we're laying out a list, it means that there are people who don't fit anywhere on that list but they, nevertheless, can demand these services. I don't trust bureaucracies with that kind of loose language. When we're talking about the venues or the areas or the facilities where these services can be provided, we, again, use that loose language "including, but not limited to." Although if you look at the listing, that listing, itself, covers every...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...reasonable location from which these services can flow. So is it going to be my responsibility to start offering amendments to rewrite a bill on the floor? Or should we pass over this bill, or when time comes to vote to advance it, don't advance it?. It is not in condition to be advanced, but I'll tell you what. We got 22 days left, and I'm not going to rewrite every bad bill that I see on the floor, and when I say bad, I'm not even talking about the idea behind it but the drafting of it, but I'll do what I can on them. And if the body doesn't help, then I'm going to try to kill them. It's too much work for me to do when there are other matters that I think of as being very important to me. My amendment up there is very inconsequential. I will offer two or three others to get rid of some of this other language, and...
