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older individuals who are anxious to be enrolled in day care programs but have to stay on waiting lists until there is an opening. Does this mean that they will not be put in a day care program, they will have somebody come to their house? Is that what this means?

SENATOR AGUILAR: This only means that this is just a temporary fill in until they do get in to a day care program.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What...how...what will be done for them is what I'm asking? They will have somebody come over to their house?

SENATOR AGUILAR: The volunteer will go to their house, spend time with them.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And why, if a person needs this day care because he or she is physically impaired, these people who are the volunteers don't have to be trained to minister to that physical impairment?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Well, they won't be trained in the sense that they are providing any medical assistance, but I mean as far as helping them in and out of situations, wheelchair situations, there will be training provided for that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What does physically impaired mean? And here's what I mean, it does not say disabled, so these people don't have to be disabled, do they?

SENATOR AGUILAR: To my knowledge, physically impaired or disabled, there is not a lot of difference in that meaning.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If you lack a hand, are you physically impaired?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, I would say so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you are not necessarily disabled, you can wash yourself, you can prepare your food, you can get in and out of the bathtub.
