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amendment which I hope we will adopt, and another is an amendment to the committee amendment, which brings the district court judges on board and makes them supportive of the bill, and that will be presented as an amendment to the committee amendment. So, I hope all together, I wanted to put it all together for you on one sheet, so you could see how it would be if we have it the way we would like it. And then for those of you who want more detail, I...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN PRESIDING

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I've given you a section-by-section handout that you can look at, if you want to identify specific language. I've passed out to you an editorial from the Grand Island Independent which I thought was...stated a very rational basis for why we should be appointing rather than electing judges. And then there are...there's a financial sheet. This...there is a sheet that's been passed out to you that does not have a heading at the top, but it has categories, personnel, court costs, federal reimbursement, and then on the right-hand column the total savings in each individual county, as best we can calculate them at this particular point in time. And I, when I have a little more time, I'm going to explain that chart a little more to you so you can understand a couple of things that need further refinement on this chart. And then I've passed out to you a fiscal note. This is the fiscal note that will pertain, once the committee amendment and the subsequent amendment are adopted.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The fiscal amendment on the bill currently is not appropriate. And I'll get back to these when I have more time. Thank you, Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: (Visitor introduced.) The Chair of the Judiciary Committee, Senator Brashear, you're recognized to open on the committee amendments.
