make a couple comments ahead of time, but my counties are small, of course, and all of them show minus except two, and if they would join together and be like one clerk in the county, would...would they be overloaded if the child support still stays with the county to be collected? And you might explain just a little bit more on the county savings and the minuses in my counties and see if you can...I know you've done a lot of work on this, so I wanted to kind of further that question with you just a little bit more. Explain on the county savings a little bit more. If they're a minus it's not helping me any; if they're a plus it is. And explain the difference there of why it would be one way and then the other.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you respond, Senator Beutler?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure. Senator, the only...the only places the zeros will appear are the ex officio counties where...where the county clerk is acting as the clerk of the district court.

SENATOR JONES: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And the information that came back to us from the counties when we sent out the surveys on this, many of the counties didn't try to break that down, either because they couldn't or they didn't themselves or for whatever reason. I wanted to show all the counties on the chart. I maybe should have been better off just eliminating those counties that have a zero, because the fact of the matter is you can't lose money doing this. You may not gain much if you're a small county, but you can't lose any money if the system is working like it's supposed to be working, which I think it is. So Garfield, Gosper, Grant, Hooker, Howard, some of your other counties, those all should have some figure where the zero is and the minus figure on the right-hand side will not be there for any of them. Once we find out...once they're able to...if they're willing to, if they're able to break down their costs in terms of how much work their county clerk/clerk of the district court does in one area and how much he does, or she does, in the other area. Did I make that clear?
