that time and 133 were USDA inspected...or 133 are USDA inspected plants. And I guess the assumption at that time was there could be as many as 200 plants that would come under the program. That's just some figures that we had back four years ago. Senator Janssen, I think the 1960s were not all that good as far as state inspection laws were concerned in Nebraska and I think that's probably why you had the federal laws passed when they were that took away...it started regulating how things were done across the nation. I would like to just add something else that I think is timely. Senators...Senator Robak's bill comes at a pretty...at a time when the federal government is actually considering legislation to lift the interstate ban on in-state inspected meats, and so that would fall in place after and would have an effect on this bill with, when you have intrastate inspection, you would also be able to move your...your product interstate if this federal bill is passed. I think she mentioned it to you by...it's ones introduced by Congress and Mac Thornberry from Texas and it's HR 1617. It would allow regional packers to expand their markets and perhaps compete with some of the large packers which currently dominate the meat slaughter and processing scene. With that, I would just urge your support and advancement of the committee amendments.
