I think that the...it also gives you the opportunity for, as it's currently drafted and the amendments are presented, it gives the opportunity for this director that's appointed over in the Department of Agriculture to stop it if it isn't going to work. I mean, he can tell whether it's (inaudible) or not. It could stop then. But I'm sure willing to look at any amendments you want to present to us.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR DIERKS: Yeah.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: And if I have any time left, I'll give it to Senator Robak and I'll...I'm done. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Wehrbein. Senator Robak.

SENATOR ROBAK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President. Senator Wehrbein, I agree, if there isn't any interest in that time I think that is a reasonable time frame. I see I, myself, and I...what length of time I've been working on with the people I've been working on, probably we wouldn't see anything wrong in that...in that time frame. And you'll do that on Select. Yeah, thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Robak. Senator Janssen, on the Robak amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. Just...just a few more comments I wanted to make was on we had some people from the...from the Nebraska State Buffalo Association and they are looking for places to market these buffalo through also, and I understand that the...that the demand for buffalo is getting greater all the time. We are having more buffalo introduced into the state too, especially out west where there's a certain individual who's been buying considerable amounts of land, putting buffalo on. You're going to see buffalo introduced into the marketplace more than you have in the past, and I just wanted to add this to the conversation that you're gong to see a lot of this happening in the near future.
