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But if, and I'm ignorant of, to some extent, of the technologies here. If that...let's start with the technologies. What...these copying...this copying equipment or these copying machines, are these real small, little machines, or can these be real large machines? And what if the public office doesn't have space or a place for these machines? I would yield some of my time to Senator Brashear to respond to the question.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you. Senator Beutler, I'm not going to...not an expert at this or anything else, so I'm not going to try and be. But, first of all, I would give you as a reference, when I was speaking of thousands of pages of copying, I was thinking specifically in terms of some of the public interest litigation that takes place with regard to petitions and that sort of thing. And people refer to copying machines being outside in the hallway, outside the Secretary of State's Office for the purpose of copying. So I wanted to use your time to indicate it's those kinds of things that sometimes require a great number of copies. When you talk about the technology, I mean, I, personally, know of scanning devices that are quite small. And if somebody wanted to scan in and make a part of diskette storage in this computer age, particular documents, they might choose to do that as opposed to photocopying.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Let me just ask a question of intent then. I assume that the equipment would not be disruptive. But to the extent that there might not be space in the office for that equipment, would the office be required to provide space for that equipment?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Beutler, I don't think so. I mean there are portable copiers. We're clearly making the ability to do...the ability to do it on your own is all subject to mutual...that we've got mutuality built in throughout, so we're envisioning a cooperative effort.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Um-hum.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: In other words the custodian would provide it at the public rate, in the public way, within three days or
