SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...because they're in control.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, the reason I asked you this kind of a question is because there is currently a law...

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...in place with regard to the register of deeds, for example, that they are required to provide space for people who examine certain kinds of records. And that has been a point of contention and a question has always been there as to whether they're required to provide a table, a table for a computer, whether they're...and some of this question is dissipating now with the evolving technologies and the ability of people to hook up to register of deeds computers, for example. But...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I would only point out...it's your time, Senator Beutler. But I'd only quickly point out I think there's a difference between that kind of examination, you're the real estate expert, but where you might spend hours reading the abstract of title and so on, whereas here we are talking about the function of copying.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. But your answer is satisfactory, if the answer is that they are not required to provide any additional space.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Beutler, you may continue.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The second part of my question is, and I...and tell me if this represents a change, but it seems to me that with regard to the second part of the bill, the part that has to do with the public entities themselves making the copies, it says, on page 2, down around lines 11 and 12, the actual cost of making copies shall not, shall not include the cost of salaries
