such and such, and embroil people in a long argument which could be done away with if the language is changed. So that's the point that I wanted to make and the suggestion that I would offer. But, as I said, I'm not going to try to amend it or reword anything. Senator Coordsen's amendments have been added. Between now and the time the bill gets on Select File, as I stated earlier, I intend to read it and get a clear understanding of the totality of what is being offered. Right now there is more or less piecemeal discussion of the committee amendment, the bill and the amendments that are being offered, because that's the way you have to deal with the bill at this time. But I'm trying to grasp as much of what is going forth as I can. I want to serve notice to my other colleagues, not you, Senator Brashear, to my colleagues on another matter, because I said I'm going to talk about it from time to time, there is a bill that I really dislike, it's LB 1234. And I'm going to fight that bill tooth and nail. And I want to let my colleagues know, because a lot of you have signed on that bill, I'm not (laugh) doing it to punish any of you. So don't get heartburn, don't get sweaty palms, because Ernie is not out to get you, but I'm out to get that bill and I'm going to get it. On bills of the kind that are before us now it would be good for anybody who has an interest in public records, the public's access to them, to look at a bill like this while it's before us so that if you have questions on any part of it, just like I have questions, I'm supposed to know everything, if something is not clear to me, I will ask. When Senator Brashear is working on a bill I have found him to be willing to work out any problems that may exist. If you reach an impasse, then you just have to take your position and he'll take his.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But if there is language in the bill that anybody feels is not clear, there should be a discussion of that language. I appreciate the fact that Senator Beutler raised the question that he did, because that's one of the items that had gotten past me at this point in my consideration of the bill. But if I see additional things, I will query Senator Brashear on them.
