SENATOR BRASHEAR: We had that discussion. In other words, they may be able to obtain what they need less expensively by doing the copying themselves.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay, so there is an option they can request not to have this done, is that correct, a...like a sheriff, for instance?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: The standard procedure would be the request is made of the sheriff, the sheriff will provide the copy, the sheriff will charge the cost.

SENATOR ROBAK: Okay. And also from some public schools the question was...I think that one's been answered, though. I apologize for that. But I'm sorry I didn't have this file before.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That's fine.

SENATOR ROBAK: I think that answers my questions, thank you.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Robak. Senator Kremer, on the advancement of LB 628.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I'd like to ask Senator Brashear a couple questions also.
