help after we introduced the bill, to be sure that it comes in and does what we wanted it to do originally. And also Dave Landis and the Banking and Insurance Committee have been great help. David will speak about the committee amendments in due time. The bill clearly acknowledges that the provider of health coverage may apply its normal managed care procedures to minimize the cost of providing the additional benefit. The bill specifically provides that prior authorization or any other requirement of a managed care plan under the terms of the health coverage agreement would apply to such a claim. If there are copayment requirements, deductibles, preferred provider requirements, the bill is intended to allow the health coverage provider to them for the use of this benefit. Allowing the managed care procedures and limitations of the health coverage agreement is intended to reduce concern for the potential cost of this additional benefit. And I want to emphasize once more that this is for the anesthesia and hospitalization. It's not necessarily for the dental care, it's for the hospitalization and anesthesia, because that's what is not getting covered now. Parents end up or adults and so on end up with a bill that they hadn't counted on when they are...when they go to the hospital to have this particular dental work done. Not all health coverage is required to provide the additional benefit. The bill acknowledges ERISA preemption, and also would not require limited benefit, nor supplemental insurance policies to cover the coverage. So it also finally states that hospital and hospitalization includes an ambulatory surgery center and care at that center. With that, I will...I will stop. If you have questions, I'll be glad to answer them. And I think that Senator Landis, after he introduces the committee amendments, that then probably he can help answer questions, too. Thank you.
