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the federal government or the state government, where that has been used as a rationale for a temporary or permanent tax exemption?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I'm not aware of any other, but there are, as I understand, the...something like 13 states that have granted either permanent or temporary exemptions for this particular issue as of this date.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, that's interesting but not convincing since I've...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, that's what I thought, but I...(laugh)

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...noticed in recent years that national organizations tend to have national bills and they try to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Senator Beutler, though, to take your argument and put it in the real world is that these people are going to have to expend money. This isn't play money that they're going to have to come out. And they're not all huge. When you think of TV you think of ABC, CBS, FOX, and the major companies. That's not who this is. That's not who this money goes to. This goes to the television station that sits in Hastings, Nebraska, who may have to expend \$7 million, not because they're going to get any more. The market in Hastings is not going to expand and be able to attract more advertisers. They're going to be stuck with a substantial expense and cost, and they're going to have to do it in a relatively quick period of time. They buy equipment that they amortize over 30 years. They're not going to get 30 years to ease into this. In a short period of time, they're going to be required to cease and start a whole new way of operating. And the fiscal note, and I know that there's some
