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SENATOR ENGEL: Oh, I'd like to answer that and spend a little bit, if you give me time, and if you don't have enough time, my light is on and I'll give it back to you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR ENGEL: But what I'd like to preface this with, when Senator Hilgert brought this up in General File, he was concerned about making it mandatory, that county attorneys check every case and across the surrounding states and the country. He did not say anything about discrimination. So that subject was not brought up, as far as I'm concerned. I do not believe in discrimination. I never have and I never will. But the thing is, before he also brought up that the...if the county attorneys do not have an incentive. Well, prior up to this point, they did not have an incentive to check it in other states because there is nothing they could do as far as enhancing the penalty. Now with this law, if its passed and, hopefully, it will be, that now every county attorney will have the incentive to check other records in other states, and I would think if you're picked up for drunk driving, whether you're Hispanic, or whether you are a white, or Native American, or whatever, that they, if they are convicted here, that they would check their record across the country; because of computers, and so forth, I don't know why they can't do that, so they've got the incentive to do it and I'm just...I just...I guess I have enough faith in the system that they will do it for everyone, not pick on...on particular minorities, and so forth.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Engel, do you think they should check it for everyone?

SENATOR ENGEL: Yes, I think they should...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, why should...

SENATOR ENGEL: ...but can I ask you one question, one more question, and I'll give you the rest of your time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay, go ahead.
